

PRICING & OPTIONS:

OPTION 1: CERTIFICATION AT YOUR SITE

This is the right class if you have new operators and need to train them according to OSHA 29CFR1910.178. If you have existing operators and are unsure of the quality or content of their past training, if you are missing their paperwork or if they were certified through a prior employer, this is the right option. The class includes classroom instruction, written testing and hands-on evaluations for each type of forklift. Our instructors bring to life the realities of what can happen when forklifts are not operated safely, operators will leave feeling much different about their role in forklift safety.

Class size: Minimum billing of 6 operators, maximum class size is 15.

Time frame: 5-8 hours depending on the number of trainees and forklift types.

Pricing: \$150 per trainee.

OPTION 2: RE-EVALUATION AT YOUR SITE

Our re-evaluation course is for companies with operators who have already been certified at your company and are in need of re-evaluation. OSHA requires forklift operators be re-evaluated at least once every three years. Topics covered include operator focus, pedestrian safety and the importance of seatbelts and pre-shift inspections. We use real life accident examples to remind your operators about the consequences of unsafe actions. It's a WAKE-UP CALL for your experienced operators, who already know how to operate safely, but may not be applying it every day on the job.

Class size: Minimum billing of 6 operators, maximum class size is 20.

Time frame: 1-hour classroom, plus hands-on evaluation time

Pricing: \$110 per trainee

NOTE: Normal training hours are weekdays from 6AM to 6PM. Saturday and non-standard hour training are available for a \$200 per class additional flat fee. Reasonable travel charges will apply to any operator training conducted outside of Ohio.
